ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHT



Margery's playwrighting credits include James and Johnno and Milo's Wake, International productions of Milo's Wake include Christchurch, Auckland, Wellington, London, the Edinburgh Festival, and a Japanese translated production in Tokvo. Milo's Wake won the 2001 New South Wales Premier's Literary Award for Best Stage Play, the 2000 Matilda Award, the Perform/4MBS Award. and an AWGIF Nomination 2001. Other plays include *X-Stacy* (two national tours and Matilda Award nomination), Way Out West: Still Standing:

Gladys, My Life is Love; Snapshots from Home, (AWGIE Award 1996) and What Next? (AWGIE Award 1998). Other awards include the 2002 Trust Award for Excellence for Outstanding Contribution to Theatre in Queensland and Australia and the 2002 Playlab Award for Services to New Work in Queensland and the 2003 Centenary Medal for Services to Queensland Theatre.

Margery has appeared in numerous musicals for the Queensland Theatre Company including *A Rum Do; Crushed by Desire; Annie; Hello Dolly; Applause; Cloudland;* Animal *Farm;* Chorus of *Disapproval,* and *Seven Little Australians.* She returned to the stage for a role in the premiere production of *Lottie, the Musical* produced by VPs in 2007. Margery has just finished a successful season, appearing in Aleathea Monsour's and her daughter, Katy Forde's, award-winning musical *A Girl's Guide to World War*, at the Brisbane Powerhouse.



ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Maria Plumb joined VP in 1962 and her first role was in *Our Hearts Were Young and Gay*. Since then, she has performed in many plays, including *Pygmalion*; *The Miracle Worker, Woman in a Dressing Gown*; *A Doll's House*; *Money and Friends*; *Cat on a Hot Tin Roof*, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, and *Over the River and Through the Woods*. For Arts Theatre she has performed in *Death of a Salesman*, for Camerata in Pinter's *Old Times*, and for Community

Theatre in *Dusa*, *Fish*, *Stas* and *Vi*, and *Cabaret*. While on a working holiday in London, Maria studied acting at the Marian Naylor Academy, and directing for community theatre at the City Literary Institute. She has directed *Stage Door*, *Travelling North*; *Away*, *Fresh Fields*; *An Italian Straw Hat*, and last year's *Quartet* She collaborated with husband Rod Thompson in adapting and directing *The Busybody*, and in 2006 directed *Dr Ox: The Experiment*, written by husband Rod. Maria was most recently seen at St Luke's in *Ladies in Lavender*, and Villanova Players as Patricia Highsmith in *Switzerland*.

A WORD FROM THE DIRECTOR

What can I say about this production – the play speaks for itself. It emphasises the harshness, the horror, the deprivation, and futility of war, as expressed by the wonderful interviewees from the 1995 Queensland Performing Arts Trust Prime of Life Oral History programme. Margery Forde has taken these interviews and devised a beautiful play, an illustrated verbatim history of World War 11, as lived by these 24 Queenslanders, on the 50th anniversary of the end of the war. Their memories are the play - but of course their memories included many events and moments of humour, so it is not all gloom and doom.

I came to the Direction when concerns of COVID led Leo Wockner, the original Director to withdraw. I was so sorry to see this happen, as he had already done the difficult task of allocating the lines to the cast of 11 actors.

We got going again, and waded straight into learning the songs and dances, which the actors have enjoyed so much. Rosemary (Music) and Lynette (Choreographer and Movement Co-ordinator) brought so much expertise to the rehearsal room. I am in awe of the confidence they have engendered within the cast, the enthusiasm to learn something new and "show 'em." Bless 'em all! Especially Rod Thompson, who has compiled the audio visuals and lighting design as well as being in the play.




